#### 2024 School Contributions and Charges

Financial support provided by parents plays a significant role in the provision of resources that extend the school's capacity to add value to the learning experiences of our students. This support is provided in the form of voluntary contributions, charges for optional components of the learning, sporting and musical programs, the provision of personal use items, and a contribution to the P&C Association.

An explanation of how each contribution and charge is applied to the learning experience is provided below, along with the estimated cost, and method of payment. This is intended to enable you to calculate the annual maximum cost that may be incurred according to your child's year level and participation.

The Inglewood Primary School Board has endorsed this schedule of contributions and charges for 2024 and it aligns with the *School Education Regulations 2000* legislation.

## 1. Voluntary Contributions

Definition: Funds used towards the cost of materials, services and facilities used by students in the educational program. Contributions are voluntary, but the quality of our teaching and learning program is enhanced when all families contribute to the costs of our educational programs, supplementing funding from other sources, including the State and Commonwealth governments.

Contribution amount: \$60 per student

## Payment may be made:

- through the nominated booklist supplier, Campion, when purchasing personal items in Term 4, 2023
- with electronic funds transfer into the school bank account.

## 2. Charges for Extra Cost Optional Components

Definition: Estimated charges for your child's participation in in school activities, excursions, and activities. Students will only incur costs when they are involved in a particular activity. ## 3. Provision of Items for Personal Use

Definition: The purchase of items that a student requires every day at school to fully participate in the learning activities. The list of items for personal use will vary from student to student.

Pupil requirements for selected students and not directly part of the education program, eg. musical instruments, class photographs, Year 6 Leaver's shirt, etc.

Some items, such as calculators and headphones, may be used in following years. Other items, such as pens, pencils, glue, may need to be replenished throughout the year. A list of recommended items is provided for each child in the form of a 'personal item' list.

Parents may purchase the items from their chosen retailer or use the school's nominated supplier, Campion Education.

Campion Education does not pay a commission to the school on items purchased through the Back-to-School program. All items listed are recommended by the class teachers as their preferred brands.

## 4. Other Voluntary Approved Requests

The Inglewood Primary School P&C Association requests voluntary contributions as listed below

\$50.00 for 1 child

\$80 for 2 children

\$100 for 3 or more children.

Funds raised are used to benefit all students across the campus (eg. Music/Phys. Ed. equipment, Library/reading books, playground equipment).

Payment of requested contributions lessens the need for a large number of fundraising activities. Payments can be made through Campion at the time of purchasing personal item lists.
