


2024 Pre-primary Information for Parents

Transition


Starting Pre-primary is a time of excitement and also change.

- Talk about school in a confident, positive and realistic

way

Instead of
"You will learn how to read"
Try
"You will learn lots of things"

Instead of
"You will make lots of friends"
Try
"You will get to meet lots of kids some may become great friends"

Instead of
"You have to go to bed early because you have school."

Try
"You need to go to bed in time so you can get enough rest ready for tomorrow"

What to bring to Pre-primary...

- School bag
- Water bottle
- Broad brim hat
- Fruit / vegetables for recess (In a separate container)
- Lunch box
- Spare set of clothes

*Please make sure all items are labelled



School bag

School bag to be big enough to fit a lunchbox, fruit container, water bottle, spare set of clothes, a jumper and hat.







Lunch box and water bottle

- Easy to open (Please practice opening and closing their lunchboxes to encourage independence)
- •Fit easily into their school bag.
- •Please no lollies and chocolate.
- The children always have access to their water bottles throughout the day.

Canteen

First day

On arrival we ask parents to place the personal items into the labelled containers

*Only label your child's library bag, and headphones.

When the door opens please come in and participate in an activity at a table with your child.

When the teacher rings the bell, please say a quick goodbye. The staff will settle your child on the mat with some songs.

First weeks of Pre-primary

The first two weeks of pre-primary can be exhausting for new learners. To make the transition smooth and less overwhelming, we ask parents to:

- join us for a table activity
- leave promptly when the bell rings
- have a planned farewell routine
- make a strong connection at the end of the day
 We will call if they do not settle.

What clothes to bring and wear

- Comfortable clothes to play in. There is a Pre-primary uniform available.
- Wear shorts/pants/skort that are easy to take off and on when going to the toilet.
- Brim hat —with their name.
- Spare set of clothes and under-wear for accidents or water play.
- Shoes At Inglewood all PP children can take their shoes off when arriving at class. Walking barefoot develops a sense of body awareness.
- Shoes must be easy for your child to take off and put on.
- Please label all your child's belongings.
